

A day-conference jointly organized by the University of Wales Centre for Advanced Welsh and Celtic Studies and the Brecknock Society as part of the AHRC-funded project:



**Curious Travellers: Thomas Pennant and the Welsh and Scottish Tour 1760–1820.**
